Greetings from Greenland,

VIRUS UPDATE: *As of right now, we in Greenland do not have any cases of the Corona virus. Several months ago we had up to 14 minor cases. Our life is just as if there is no virus, although traveling in and out of Greenland requires quarantining & testing prior to coming into Greenland, but very few are traveling.*

GOD'S GRACE:

*Life is up and down for all of us, but for us we don't really have people to discuss our issues with (Luke 6:22), but as the month continued the Lord gave us encouragement. One major encouragement was connecting with a group of people that have come together **all over the world** with a common link, which is using boats for ministry work. The organization is called Kings Fleet. We connected through a zoom meeting online, last week and we met many different people on the mission field with similar ministry issues. I received a lot of great advice about boats and what we need to do to help us on our missions north.*

Another encouraging event was a person called me out of the blue, a person we barely know that doesn't speak much English said, I am coming to pick you up right now. We had no idea what he had planned. He picks us up to take us to his storage yard to give me some big rope and a 2 ton piece of steel equipment to be used as a new mooring for our boat FREE. You see, last month I received a call at about 7am to be told that our boat was drifting out to sea. What had happened was the mooring we had was not heavy enough to hold our boat in 35+kts winds and "Qaamaneq", our boat, was dragging our mooring out to sea, or the rocks or somewhere, the wind was blowing the boat out of our harbor and basically lose and drifting. The salvation of the boat is another story of itself. I had to go in the water again to untangle

the ropes off the propellers when I backed into our mooring rope while retrieving the boat and moving it back to safety.

Also as the month went on, I was invited to go fishing twice with a Greenlandic gentleman that we had ministered to several months ago. Inviting people over we only know in passing for dinner is going well, and the Bible studies are going great too. On top of all that, when we went to Aasiaat to take the boat out of the water for the winter, as well as doing repairs, I was able to teach on Wednesday night at the Pentecostal church and have a youth meeting twice during the same week, teaching the Word and encouraging some youths we never met before. The grace of God abounds, we just have to look around and be sensitive to the spirit of God and obey His directions.

In our Bible study a little over a week ago, there was a new young lady that has been asking very important questions and she had tears in the middle of the study. Please pray for her. Her name is Juliana, a 20 year old with many issues in her life. More fruit we hope!!

THE BOAT:

The boat is in dry dock at Aasiaat for repairs and winter storage. We tried to cover the cabin windows and upper & mid deck with a tarp and fishing net. It was too windy to try to put a tarp on so we just covered what we could with a big fishing net. We pray it will be at least a deterrent for thieves, although we removed pretty much everything from the boat.

As for the damage that occurred while north, the shafts looked OK, it was just the propeller blades and rudders that need repair. To remove the blades only, and then to repair the rudders as well as a few other issues within that system is costing \$4000 US dollars. Our storage for the winter which includes taking the boat out of the water and putting it back in, insurance while out of the water which means if it blows over costs \$6000, which we pay on monthly. But none of this is including the propeller repair, which is sending the blades to Denmark for repair, we have to wait and see.
